Religious Education News

Registration for the 2012-2013 Religious Education year will begin March 18th and extend to May 20th. **All new and returning students are required to complete a registration form.** Forms will be located in Hart House and in the entrances to the Gathering Space. Registrations received after May 20th will be subject to a late fee with placement in a regularly scheduled class on a space available basis only.

Grade 10 Students - Candidates for confirmation are reminded that the following documents must be submitted to the Religious Education Office: 1) Confirmation Information Requirements form; 2) evidence of a completed service project; 3) a letter addressed to Father Golas requesting the sacrament; and 4) a sponsorship certificate for their sponsor.
