This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). As Catholics we are greatly blessed to have the Sacrament of the Eucharist as the visible and tangible way the Risen Lord is close to us. In this Sacrament which draws us together on the Lord's Day, we listen to the Lord's words in our Scripture readings and we receive the Lord in Holy Communion.
