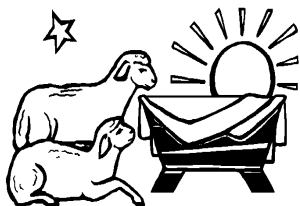

### **Parish Council November 6 Bulletin Minutes**

**Women's Guild:** The Guild's recent Pasta Supper yielded \$736 from the raffle and \$1809 from sale of tickets. Next meeting is Nov. 14. Member Maureen Kreh will share videos of her July 2010 pilgrimage to Austria and Germany, which culminated in performance of Oberammergau Passion Play. Guild's annual Christmas Party to be held on Dec. 11. Guild's Corned Beef Dinner has been changed from March 12 to March 19.

**Haitian Ministry:** The Haitian Ministry has received a \$5,000 grant to support their efforts in providing financial assistance to the parish of Ste. Therese. The Ministry will hold a Flatbread fundraiser on Dec. 18 at 5:00; the fund-raiser will also include a silent auction. Mary Ann Dubin and Donna Dellacamera, along with four members of St. Patrick's Church (Collinsville) will travel to Haiti in February.

**Parish Picnic/Unionville Festival:** Mary Beth thanked Council members who assisted at the Parish Picnic and at the Unionville festival. Eighty people participated in the raffle. Parishioner Terry Jakupco won the raffle basket. A suggestion was made that the video of St. Mary parish life, shown at the Unionville Festival, be put on the parish website. Mary Beth will seek permission from those parishioners who signed photo releases for the video.

**Patriotic Rosary:** Maureen Kreh thanked Council members who attended the Patriotic Rosary. She also recognized the efforts of the Legion of Mary in helping to organize and pray the Rosary.

**Year of Faith/Catholicism DVD:** Bob Murphy gave the Council the schedule for the first two lessons of the DVD series. The first lesson is tentatively scheduled to be shown on Dec. 3 at 7:00. The second lesson is tentatively scheduled for Dec. 10 at 7:00. The series will continue in Lent on the following dates: 2/18, 2/25, 3/4, 3/18, and 3/25.

**Wine and Cheese/Coffee Sunday:** Mary Beth thanked members who participated in the Parish Council Meet and Greet held recently after all the Masses. Mary Beth received much input from parishioners at the Meet and Greets, and shared input received regarding Building and Grounds, Human Needs, Liturgy, Religious Education and Parish Council.
