St. Mary's Parish Council Minutes for November 6, 2013~ Bulletin Edition

Human Needs: The annual food drive, held in October, was successful. Food contributions were given to both the Farmington and Burlington Food Banks. This year's Giving Tree will be displayed the weekend after Thanksgiving.

Men's Retreat: Bob Bonato and John Keany attended a Recruitment Support Meeting at Holy Family Monastery, and are making plans for the February 21 Men's Retreat.

Décor Committee: The committee is in the process of planning the St. Joseph Statue area and the plaque for the Father Golas Gathering Space.

Decorations: The committee continues its work decorating the church for the liturgical seasons of Christmas and Easter.

Eucharistic Ministers: There will soon be four new Eucharistic Ministers. They will be trained in November, and then be commissioned.

Fun: The Christmas Ornament Workshop will be held the Sunday following Thanksgiving.

Legion of Mary: As a result of declining membership in the Legion of Mary, the morning Praesidium will be merging with the evening Praesidium. It was recommended that the Legion provide information in an upcoming church bulletin regarding its various ministries.

Scouts: Cub Scout Pack 170 tended a garden plot this spring and summer at the Farmington Kolp Community Garden. Some of the harvest was sold as a fund raiser at the Farmers Market at Hillstead Museum. Over 150 lbs. of fresh vegetables were donated to the Farmington Food Pantry.

On Sunday, 11/17, from 2:00-3:30, the committee will sponsor an intergenerational storytelling event to honor the life of St. Francis. Presenter will be Sharon Lynch.

Haitian Ministry: The Haitian Ministry held a fundraiser at Flatbread Pizza on Tuesday, November 5, to raise money to feed the children of St. Therese Parish in Haiti.

Adult Choir: The adult choir is in the process of rehearsing for Christmas.

Ministry Fair: Amanda McCaffrey thanked the various committees which made the Ministry Fair a success. In particular, she thanked Betty Faitella for assembling the Parish Council basket and Ed O'Reilly, for creating and printing committee brochures and business cards.

Unionville Festival: Denise Genest thanked Council members who assisted at the Unionville Festival. The Council provided flyers, brochures, book marks and a video of St. Mary parish life, which Amanda helped to design.

Reception for Fr. Golas and Fr. St. Martin: The reception for Fr. Golas and Fr. St. Martin was well attended. Rosemary Frombach compiled a DVD with music from the various pictures taken that day. A copy of the DVD will be given to the priests as a remembrance of the occasion.

Storage Area: Shelves have been installed in the storage area for custodial supplies. Further plans for organizing the storage area include transferring some of the storage materials to the Hart House.

St. Joseph Statue: The new statue of St. Joseph will cost approximately \$11,000. Special envelopes will be available for donations toward the statue.

Plaque: A meeting was held last week to discuss the design of the plaque for the Father Golas Gathering Space. The new plaque will replace the clock that is in the gathering space.
