**St. Mary Star of the Sea -September 2, 2014  
Parish Council Meeting Minutes**

Msgr. Motta provided the opening prayer by asking God for his continued blessings on our parish, our parishioners and her council members as we begin our new year. A motion was made and accepted to approve the minutes of the June 2, 2014 Parish Council meeting as submitted.

There are two possible candidates for the RCIA process. There are 404 students registered for religious education this year. Last year there were 530 students. Deacon Tom noted this is not unusual, as other communities in the valley have also experienced a decline in numbers.

A three-month Calendar of Events will be published and displayed on the Peer Connections bulletin board, as well as on the parish website; it will be passed out during Kickoff Weekend. The Service Team met during the summer to start organizing service projects. Nineteen participants attended Soul Fest 2014 from August 7 – 8. A few teens also participated in the Walk4Water, whose goal it is to raise money for the upkeep of wells in central Africa.

On October 9, 16 and 23 the Doubt Study Group for high school and college students will meet. The focus will be on three biblical figures and how these figures dealt with doubt and their faith. The monthly meeting for DIVE! will take place on October 24<sup>th</sup>. The monthly meeting for LEAP! will take place on October 25<sup>th</sup>. The service project for October will be a weekend backpacking program with Gifts of Love.

Family Movie Night will take place on November 8<sup>th</sup> and will feature *God's Not Dead*. The monthly meeting of DIVE! will be held on November 14<sup>th</sup> and the monthly meeting of LEAP! will be held on November 15.

As of September 2 there are 22 altar servers in the program. Four altar servers retired as of September 1 and three will start as of September 6.

The Parish Finance Committee met in the Rectory on July 27 to review the first six months of the budget. There are no major financial issues or concerns at this time. Overall results are very close to budgeted amounts.

The next Human Needs Committee meeting will take place on September 17<sup>th</sup>. The committee collected over 40 pounds of pull tabs for the Shriners' Hospital this summer. Many school supplies were collected during the month of August for the Town of Farmington. October will be Food Bank month. The Giving Tree will be prepared again in time for Advent.

Some parishioners have volunteered to take care of the areas around the church, the rectory and the Hart House in an effort to make these areas look more presentable. Mulch has been ordered and will be put around the church.

We are awaiting a contractor's quote regarding repair of the Hart House steps. Quotes from other contractors will also be sought. A dimmer switch burned out in the electrical room of the church and caused some minor damage. Replacement and damage costs are being investigated.

CL&P has been contacted regarding the fence in the lower parking lot. CL&P said they would repair the fence and clean up the surrounding area. According to the last four electric bills, we are saving an average of \$345.00 a month due to the new energy efficient lights installed in the church.

The drainage system at the cemetery has been installed. Pinning of a new area at the cemetery is complete. These plots will soon be offered for sale to our parishioners.

The Knights of Columbus will hold a car show on September 19<sup>th</sup> and a Pork Roast Barbecue on September 21.

The Women's Guild will hold a pasta supper on October 22<sup>nd</sup> at the Knights of Columbus. Coffee and Donut Sundays will resume Sunday, September 14<sup>th</sup>. Guild meetings will start again in December.

The Décor Committee met with the Women's Guild regarding increased efficiency in the kitchen area of the Gathering Space. A decision was made to use one of the existing double closets. Minor changes to the second closet will be made to increase efficiency. The Building and Grounds Committee will work on getting shelving and also new pulls for the drawers and kitchen cabinets. The Guild continues looking into refreshing the statue of Mary.

The date for Men's Retreat has been set for a weekend in February.

The Legion will be praying the Peace Rosary after the 4:30 Mass on the first Saturday of the month starting in September and continuing until June, 2015. On September 6<sup>th</sup> the Legion will be attending a pilgrimage to Our Lady of Lourdes in Litchfield, joining with all Legion Praesidia throughout Connecticut. On September 7<sup>th</sup> some members of the Legion will go to St. Stanislaus Church in Bristol to participate in making rosary beads; the goal is 2,000.

***Update from Respect Life Committee***

Under the direction of Archbishop Leonard P. Blair, our Archdiocese will again participate in the "40 Days for Life" Program. This is a peaceful, national pro-life campaign spreading across 48 states for the sanctity of life. Each of the 40 days consists of two elements: 24 hours of prayer in Eucharistic Adoration and a 12 hour vigil of prayer in peaceful action. **Eucharistic Adoration will be held at St. Ann in Avon.** St. Ann and St. Mary, Star of the Sea will join in a spirit of unity to pray, fast, and demonstrate peaceful activism. Eucharistic Adoration will begin after the Sunday morning masses from 12:00 p.m. on October 26 and continue until 9:00 a.m. on Monday October 27<sup>th</sup> at St Ann's.
