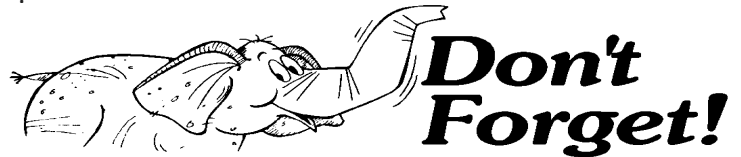

### **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Needed!**

Lay persons who assist a celebrant (the ordinary minister) in distributing Holy Communion are known as extraordinary ministers. At St. Mary Star of the Sea about 40 lay people participate in the sacred ministry of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMoHC). Those who participate regard it as a privilege, a commitment to serve the parish, and an opportunity to grow spiritually.

EMoHC's are usually scheduled for the Mass of their preference and typically serve at last two times a month. Some EMoHC's may also be called to serve members of our parish community who are unable to attend Mass due to sickness and physical hardships. Volunteers for this ministry must be practicing Catholics and be approved by the pastor. New volunteers must attend a one-day workshop on spiritual and theological topics conducted by the Archdiocese and attend a practice session.
