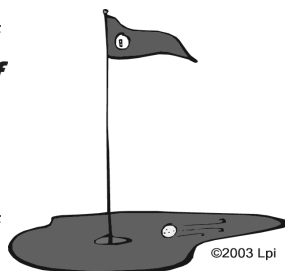
**LECTORS NEEDED!**
