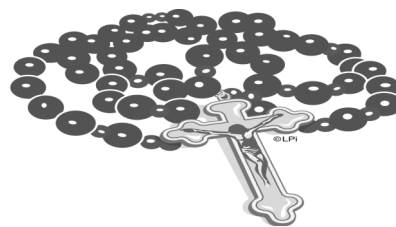
**"I Gave on line"-**
