June Saints of the Day*June 11 – Memorial of Saint Barnabas, Apostle*

St. Barnabas played an important part in the first extension of Christianity outside the Jewish world. It was Barnabas who presented St. Paul to the other Apostles when Paul came to Jerusalem after his conversion. Barnabas was St. Paul's companion throughout Greece missionary journey left him when he set out on his second journey and went to Cyprus. The name of St. Barnabas is mentioned in the Canon of the Mass.

June 13 – Memorial of Saint Anthony of Padua, Priest and Doctor of the Church

St. Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal and preached throughout Portugal and Italy.

Both as a theologian and as a popular preacher he fought vigorously against heresy. His preaching was inspired by the love of God and of souls, had an extraordinary power of conviction, and it was filled with the penetrating power of the Bible. Pope Pius XII, when he proclaimed him a Doctor of the Church, declared that he based all that he said on the texts of the Gospels, and could justly be called the Evangelical Doctor. St. Anthony lived for a time in France, but chiefly in Italy, and died at Padua in 1231 at age 36, with the reputation of great sanctity. From the day of his death innumerable miracles caused the faithful to invoke him as a wonderworker of untiring benevolence.
