## SAVE THE DATE

On **Wednesday, August 8** here at St. Mary Church, there will be a **Parish Listening Session** starting at 7:00 PM in the Gathering Space. The Session is at the request of Archbishop Blair in conjunction with the plans for a diocesan-wide ecclesiastical assembly (called a Synod) in 2020. Our Parish Listening Session will be Town Hall style. **All parishioners are invited and encouraged to attend.** Each parish has the same three questions to address:

- What are we, as an Archdiocese, doing well?
- What are we, as an Archdiocese, doing not so well?
- What are we, as an Archdiocese, not doing that we should be doing?

Each person attending will have an opportunity to share their thoughts regarding one or more of the 3 questions, limited to 2-3 minutes total per person. There will also be a box available in the Gathering Space to collect written comments to the 3 questions for persons not able to attend the Session in person

**July 11 – Memorial of Saint Benedict, Abbot -**

Born in 480 A.D. in Umbria, St. Benedict organized monastic life in 12 small monasteries before founding the great Abby of Monte Cassino in Campania, the birthplace of modern monasticism. There he wrote his “Rule” prescribing a life of prayer, study, work and community life under one superior. St. Benedict taught his followers that the sole objective of existence is the search for God.

**Did you know?**

**Did you know** that the long, white garment worn by a priest or deacon under all the other vestments is called an **Alb**? (Latin for “white”) The alb reminds the priest of his baptism, when he was clothed in white to signify his freedom from sin, purity of new life, and Christian dignity.

**Did you know** that the **Cincture** is a long, thick cord with tassels at the ends worn by a priest or deacon which secures the alb around the waist like a belt? It may be white or may be the same liturgical color as the other vestments. Spiritually, the cincture reminds the priest of the admonition of St. Peter: “So gird the loins of your understanding; live soberly; set all your hope on the gift to be conferred on you when Jesus Christ appears. As obedient sons, do not yield to the desires that once shaped you in your ignorance. Rather, become holy yourselves in every aspect of your conduct, after the likeness of the holy One who called you” (1 Peter 1:13-15).
