

September 29: Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, Archangels - Angels—messengers from God—appear frequently in Scripture, but only Michael, Gabriel and Raphael are named.

**Michael,** the protector, appears in Daniel's vision as "the great prince" who defends Israel against its enemies; in the Book of Revelation, he leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil. Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion, rising in the East in the fourth century.

**Gabriel**, the announcer, also makes an appearance in Daniel's visions, announcing Michael's role in God's plan. His best-known appearance is an encounter with Mary, who consents to bear the Messiah.

**Raphael,** the guide, is found in the Old Testament story of Tobit. There he appears to guide Tobit's son Tobiah through a series of fantastic adventures which lead to a threefold happy ending: Tobiah's marriage to Sarah, the healing of Tobit's blindness, and the restoration of the family fortune.

Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael are the Patron Saints of: The Dying, Germany, Grocers, Police Officers, and Radiologists.

**Saint Gabriel** is the Patron Saint of: Broadcasters. **Saint Raphael** is the Patron Saint of: The Blind
