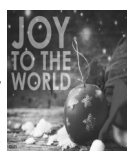


RCIA Program Seeking New Catholics

October 19: Memorial of Saints John de Brebeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs – Saints John de Brebeuf and Isaac Jogues are part of 8 martyrs who died in the 1640's in what is now Quebec, Canada and New York State. These Jesuit missionaries came from France and were successful in converting many of the Huron Native Americans. The warring Iroquois Nation captured and tortured these missionaries before making them martyrs. St. Isaac Jogues had several of his fingers cut off – this would make it impossible for him to consecrate the Eucharist since, at that time, a priest could only touch the Host with his thumb and forefinger. Because of his sacrifices and good works with the Huron Nation, Pope Urban VII gave St. Isaac permission to offer Mass despite the missing fingers. Because these men are known as the first North American Martyrs, a statue of St. Isaac Jogues stands in a park overlooking Lake George, NY, where he is blessing the lake and town.
